

More Than 27,000 Athletes Competing in World's Largest Volleyball Event This Month, With Matches Held at ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex

Marquee AAU event expected to bring more than \$52 million to Central Florida during eight-day event; 43rd annual event has more than doubled in participants over last five years

ORLANDO, Fla. (June 7, 2016) - More than 27,000 athletes from across the country, including **thousands of Orlando-area athletes**, are expected to bump, set and spike during the 43rd annual AAU Girls' Junior National Volleyball Championships in Central Florida, which began**June 18**.

The eight-day event has held the title of **largest volleyball event in the world since 2012** when the 16U Club division set the current Guinness Book of World Records mark. It attracts approximately **40,000 spectators**, **9,000 coaches** and **400 college coaches** and takes place on **177 courts** between ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at Walt Disney World Resort and Orange County Convention Center.

"The AAU Girls' Junior National Volleyball Championships is the pinnacle event for AAU Volleyball athletes," said Dr. Roger J. Goudy, President/CEO of the AAU. "The relationships we have built throughout Central Florida help make this a once-in-a-lifetime experience for all our athletes and their families."

The marquee annual event for the **fastest-growing sport in the AAU**, the AAU Girls' Junior National Volleyball Championships features 31 divisions of competition, including an international division with teams from Brazil, China, Colombia, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Puerto Rico and Slovenia.

The AAU Girls' Junior National Volleyball Championship has **more than doubled in the last five years**, increasing from approximately 1,000 teams in 2011 to more than 2,300 teams in this year's event. Still growing, the **economic impact to Central Florida is expected to be over \$52 million per year** with participants and their families visiting local hotels, shops, restaurants and other Central Florida businesses.

"We are excited to welcome the AAU Girls' Junior National Volleyball Championships to Orlando," said Visit Orlando President and CEO George Aguel. "More than 75,000 athletes, spectators and coaches will experience our wide variety of hotels, local attractions and award-winning dining that make us a top host city for sporting events."

Select championship games will air live on WatchESPN and the WatchESPN application from ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex, which has become the **worldwide leader in ESPN3 content production**. Additional

games will be streamed live on Sports Network Live.
